FROM PRESIDENT'S DESK



While conveying my good wishes and appreciation for the good work done in arranging international, national and local seminars by IETE Centres, my heart goes to the people who were affected by the 26 Dec, 2004 Tsunami. It was the worst kind of earthquake measuring 9.0 on the ritcher scale that occurred underwater in the Indian Ocean off the coast of Sumatra Island of Indonesia. The earthquake resulted in Tsunami, which caused huge loss of life and extensive damage to property in Indonesia, Malaysia,

Thailand, Myanmar, Bangladesh, India, Srilanka and Maldives. Estimates are that more than 150,000 people died and 5 million were rendered homeless who need support for rehabilitation.

Our country is among USA, Japan and Australia, who have a cooperative arrangement to coordinate the channelization of humanitarian aid activities in spite of its own massive rehabilitation task in Tsunami affected states of Andhra Pradesh, Orissa, Tamil Nadu and Kerala. It is to the credit of the Indian people and the Govt of India that all necessary initiatives have been taken to undertake reconstruction of infrastructure along with immediate measures to provide food, medicine, drinking water and shelter to the affected people.

In recent times our country has been hit by three major disasters – cyclone in Orissa, earthquakes in Maharashtra and Gujarat apart from landslides and floods in many states, which are common. The experience is that natural calamities like earthquakes, flash floods, draughts, storms, cyclones, landslides, wildfire etc are difficult to predict. What can be done is to take effective mitigation and alleviation measures to reduce loss of life and property in the event of a hazard striking. Engineering in general and communication engineering in particular have a major role to play firstly in developing detection systems for prediction of natural disasters, secondly develop failsafe communications & infrastructure in the disaster vulnerable areas and lastly in having a disaster management organization, which will disseminate well in advance the information on impending as well as already occurred calamities to the people in vulnerable areas, activate relief measures to minimize damage and reduce the delays in rehabilitation process.

IETE has a large fraternity of knowledgeable engineers, who have experience of working in R&D, manufacturing, operations and management of technical establishments. Notwithstanding, the work being undertaken by the Govt for disaster detection and mitigation, we in IETE can also think of knowledge – generation for evolution of a futuristic engineering initiative for building a reliable and cost effective technology for disaster detection, dissemination and alleviation. 



MoU between IETE and IEEE

IETE and IEEE have a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to encourage exchange of technical information and promote co-operation between both organizations. To renew this MoU and exchange views on the matters of mutual interest, a meeting with Mr W Cleon Anderson, President IEEE and IETE Council Members, present in Delhi, was organized on Jan 21, 2005. The meeting was also attended by the IEEE members of India and Delhi Chapter. IETE Council Members had discussions on perspective of joint activities; reproduction of selected articles from IEEE publications and sponsoring seminars with IEEE President. Lt Gen D P Sehgal, President IETE apprised President IEEE of the achievements of IETE in; dissemination of information, human resource development and research work the field of electronics, telecommunications, computer science and engineering. He impressed upon the President IEEE that IETE is looking forward for active participation of IEEE sponsored experts in the forthcoming International conference and IETE-Expo during the Annual Technical Convention of IETE in September 2005. Gen Sehgal also requested Mr Cleon Anderson to look into the requirements of IETE for publishing transliteration of some selected articles from IEEE publications in Hindi. On this occasion Lt Gen Sehgal and Mr W Cleon Anderson also signed and exchanged the MoU between IETE and IEEE, which will remain in force till Dec 31, 2007.

Renewal of Agreement between IETE and IEE (UK)
