NEWS FROM HEADQUARTERS

34th IETE Mid Term Symposium

34th IETE Mid Term Symposium on "Wireless & Wireline-Future Scenario" was organized during April 3-4, 2003 at Hotel Taj Lands End, Mumbai. Brig K Balasubramaniam (Retd) Chairman, TPC welcomed the technology savvy dignitaries, participants and apprised them with various programmes planned for Golden Jubilee year. An account of the overview of symposium by the Chairman, IETE Mumbai Centre, Shri G S Tuteja and words of guidance & vision by the IETE President, Prof K K Aggarwal enlightened the audience. Prof Aggarwal said that although Wireless and Wireline represent duality of role, it should, however, be used as an opportunity to solve the problems and resolve conflicts rather than as political weapon. Sufficient and appropriate infrastructure for taking the technology to masses should be built. He said that the services like telephones on demand, SMS through cellular GSM/CDMA technology are already available in major cities of our country and these facilities should be taken to other cities and rural areas of the country. He said that there is a lot of scope for technologies to co-exist and provide synergic implementation of services like telephone, TV, Fax, Internet etc. Capacity with quality has to be created at reduced cost. IETE is ready to offer its services in whichever way government decides to use them for development of society.

The Chief Guest, Padma Bhushan Dr F C Kohli formally inaugurated the symposium by lighting the ceremonial lamp. He released the souvenir marking the occasion and also a special issue of IETE Technical Review on "R&D in Electronics in India". The first copy of IETE Technical Review was handed over to the Guest Editor, Shri V P Sandlas, Chief Controller of DRDO. Dr Kohli complimented IETE for choosing most appropriate and timely topic for the symposium. He talked about his more than three & half decades of association with IETE through participation in IETE fora. Talking about India's performance in software arena, he said that information revolution has provided opportunities for Indians to penetrate into the world market. He drew attention towards low hardware production, low PC penetration as compared to neighbouring countries especially China. China has emerged more successful & competent in computer use and software production for their own country as well. India has written software for others and no doubt has earned much-needed foreign exchange. Inspite of having islands of excellence in every field, India has hardly produced any computers whereas China produces 50% of the computer used by them. He praised the work done by Prof Ashok Jhunjhunwala in designing and configuring a corDECT communication system for use in the remote and rural areas. He stressed on designing more software in native languages to increase productivity in industries such as power loom, hotel, tourism, education, agriculture etc.

The 30th Vikram Sarabhai Memorial Lecture was by Prof Ashok Jhunjhunwala, TeNeT Group, IIT M "Drivers of Telecom in India". He said the Indian te all poised for growth and people are jubilant about long distance call charges. Prof Jhunjhunwala enum bottlenecks like high capital expenditure per telephone à-vis urban and rural Indian household affordability. he said that the encouraging aspects are availability of in technology, fibre optic backbone network of private viz. Reliance, Tata, Bharati etc. He gave business in rural India consisting of corDECT WLL, optical fibre c BSNL telephone exchange at every 150 sq. km., reliable supply, service provider like n-Logue who would in operate only in rural India, banks like ICICI to provi for initial capital expenditure etc. Concluding his Jhunjhunwala said that in coming years telecom is take off in a major way doubling India's rural GDP.

The six technical sessions of the symposium were on Wireline Access, Wireless Access Networks, Cellular Broadband Communication, Telecomm-Planning & Re and Communications Convergence. The sessions were by Shri R N Bhardwaj, CGM (T), Maharashtra Circle, Shri V P Chandan, President, Qualcomm India, Air C Motial, MD, Midas Communication, Shri A K Chopra, Railtel, Shri Prithipal Singh, CMD, BSNL and Shri Srivastav, ED MTNL. The speakers were from well known industries like Tata Tele Services, Qualcomm India, Infocomm, HFCL, Motorola, Tata Broadband, TEJAS and government sector was represented by TRAI, DoT, AAI. The latest technologies of WCDMA, SDH, DSL, corDECT, WLL, 4G etc were discussed. Many scientists from R & D organizations, and academic institutions, experts from industries exchanged their ideas on the above topics over two days. This was followed by a panel discussion on April 4, 2003, chaired by Shri Prithipal Singh.

Apex Forum on Virtual Education (e-learning)

Apex forum on Virtual Education (e-learning) was organized at Pune Centre on April 5, 2003 as part of the Golden Jubilee Year celebrations. Shri P N Chopra, Chairman (ICC), briefly introduced the subject of virtual education. Prof Aggarwal said that e-learning is essential to make good the shortfall in the required number of seats in formal educational institutions for ever increasing number of students. He said e-learning will also help in improving the quality of higher education as well as to enable self study by especially those students taking distance education courses. Shri R K Arora, Executive Director of C-DAC, delivered the key-note address. He touched upon a number of issues and deliberated on the advantages of e-learning such as accessibility of lessons from best teachers by a large number of students, possibility of studies at convenient time and at a speed suiting individual capabilities, freedom to clear doubts during class room learning, instant examination & evaluation being mechanized, free from subjective factors and enabling students to know their mistakes.

Prof Ram Takawale in his speech came out very strongly in support of e-learning. He dismantled many arguments usually raised against the e-learning. He said that today the situation exists for launch of e-education since formal educational institutions are not able to meet the requirement of ever increasing admission seekers. Today we have all means such as Internet, broadband, WLAN for rural communications, education channel in satellite, people to create quality content and technology to take it where ever and who so ever requires

The panel discussion was chaired by Prof Pramod Kale. Three brief presentations were made in order to inform the participants about some new developments in e-learning. Shri Asikumar of NCST (C-DAC) Mumbai spoke on "e-learning Present & Future", Shri Zia Saquib of C-DAC, Pune on "e-dhyapeeth" (a software for enabling e-learning) and Shri Anand Bhargava of World Space, Bangalore spoke on "Tools for e-learning". The forum was attended by about 70 persons, including experts, educationists, students, IETE council members etc. It concluded with an optimistic note, favouring introduction of e-learning.


