NEWS FROM HEADQUARTERS

Report on 38th World Telecommunication Day

The 38th World Telecommunication Day, re-christened as **World Information Society Day** during the World Summit on the Information Society held in Tunis in 2005, which marks the founding of International Telecommunication Union on May 17, 1865, chose the theme *Promoting Global Cybersecurity* for the year 2006 to highlight the serious challenges we face in ensuring the safety and security of networked information and communication systems. ITU, who have been deeply engaged in connecting the unconnected, advocated the development of ICT to assist the disabled and to prepare for emergencies and disasters. In an increasingly networked society, safeguarding cyberspace as well as ICT systems and infrastructure has assumed real urgency. Secretary General, ITU, Mr Yoshio UTSUMI and Secretary General, UN, Mr Kofi A Annan in their messages have appealed to all Members States and stakeholders to help increase global awareness of cybersecurity and to develop an international network of initiatives and ICT-based countermeasures to enhance security and build trust in the use of information and communication technologies. This is also critical for the future social and economic development, especially important for the developing countries.

The President of Senegal, Mr Abdoulaye Wade and Professor Muhammad Yunus, Managing Director of Grameen Bank, Bangladesh, were honoured with the **2006 ITU World Information Society Award** at a ceremony held at Geneva on 17 May 2006. Tributes were also paid to those who made significant contributions

towards building and strengthening the Information Society.

IETE HQs at New Delhi celebrated the occasion by arranging expert talks by the known professionals in the field. Lt Gen Davinder Kumar, Chairman, Technical Programmes Committee, delivered the welcome address and introduced the subject. He called ICT as the strategic and a national issue. He mentioned about the looming fear of deadly viruses, the cyber threats and the legal issues, need for cyber ethics and the need for cyber security awareness. He gave very useful tips for a cyber secure environment and shared some of the Cyber Security protocols.

Lt Gen D P Sehgal, President IETE, in his address highlighted the contribution of IETE and its charter towards the global movement to build the Information Society. He informed the audience about the work that IETE has been doing for the advancement of the technology along with its 52 local centres and subcentres spread all over the country and abroad for the benefit of the society. Talking of the cybersecurity, he said that it was extremely important because societies are vulnerable to a wide variety of threats especially in the communication savvy world.

Dr Sundeep Oberoi of TCS, highlighted the gravity of global security whose situation was like a bumpy road. He said that cyber security management problem is a system's problem and not a technical problem or a management problem but a social problem. He explained the risks that computer users are being compelled to face and how they are forced to transact values online. Talking of challenges he pointed towards accountability, which should be specific enough to fix a criminal; intervention strategies to ensure appropriate degree of technology adoption and coping with

the consequences of information systems failure. He said that the solutions were inadequate but way out is to involve non-specialists to cope up with cybersecurity. The option is to make people aware in simple terms and in turn the ordinary people may show the way to cope with the problem. Technology is only one dimension of the solution. Equally important are policy, standard operating procedure and human factors. He ended with an optimistic note citing indomitable human spirits.

Brig A K Wahie, Commander, Army Cyber Security Establishment, Army HQs, speaking on the occasion said that though the ICT has resulted in increased productivity, reduced costs and increased efficiency, it has also lead to increased dependence, its misuse and mismanagement. He said the need for concern is because of this tussle between technology and anti-technology. The cyber attack sophistication is increasing while the requirement of intruder knowledge is reducing. These attacks propagate through Speed factor- Mass-Mailing Worms; Volume factor- Spam-like attacks; the Durable Threat- Multi variant Viruses and the Elusive Threat- Blended Attacks. Other vulnerable areas are wireless security, VoIP threats. These vulnerabilities and threats to the security of information systems are eroding public confidence in the system. The perpetrators of these threats could be individual, the target could be the entire spectrum of internet users where as the motive could be just for fun, show-off, malicious intent, or state sponsored cyber terrorism. According to Brig Wahie, the three pillars on which the information security rests are People, Processes and Technology. In People perspective, the users need to be organized into different levels and their awareness level need to be urgently addressed. There is also a need for global & national initiatives in which cultural

aspects vis-à-vis cyber ethics and cyber rights need to be formulated. From process perspective, Information Security and Management Systems like ISO-277001 series, ISO-17799 and BS-7799 are standards for certification and code of practices. Regulations like Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act 1996 (HIPPA), Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (GLBA) and Sarbanes-Oxley Act (SOX) address the specific requirements of privacy of customer Information in financial institutions business controls. So, compliance is not optional but essential. From the perspective of technology, a layered approach needs to be applied addressing the aspects of confidentiality, integrity and availability. The need is to move from reactive technologies to proactive technologies. He summarised that the cybersecurity is everybody's responsibility and awareness should proliferate to the lowest levels.

Shri Pawan Duggal, Advocate Supreme Court of India, shared his expertise on legal aspects of cyber laws. He cited some of the cases involving cyber crimes and other infringements. He recommended for an improved network security and emphasized on stringent internationally accepted cyberlaws for different kinds of cyber crimes. **Shri Sayan Ghosh of NORTEL** spoke on Architecting IT Security. **Shri Vijay Shekhar, CISCO**, spoke on "Changing Paradigm of Network Security". He talked about the evolution of security challenges. He stressed on evaluating the threats objectively. He also gave an overview of CISCO NAC solutions.

The Chief Guest of the occasion, **Shri Nripendra Misra, Chairman TRAI**, started by recalling the vision foreseen way back in 1953 by the Founding President of IETE in its present motto of "Let us do great things

together". Sensing the severe constraint of available time, he enthralled the audience by stating that his prepared speech for the occasion may be "taken as read". He assured the august gathering that TRAI is seized of the three very important issues relating to telecom sector, namely the ever widening rural-urban digital divide, allocation and management of the frequency spectrum amongst various operators and service providers using different technologies and the vexing problem of interconnectivity. He assured of his efforts to bring about paradigm shift in how TRAI is to be operators friendly and supportive rather than the mere regulator. Talking of Global cybersecurity, he said that IT related security encompasses the global desire for cooperation. Security associated with IT deployment and IT infrastructure is a major multi-facet challenge which calls for the establishment of an integrated framework. The challenge cannot be dealt with the market forces alone or by Government setup but requires an innovative mix of solutions calling for collaboration of different stakeholders, the government, the regulator, industry, academia and sector specific specialists. There is an urgent need to create awareness at all levels. He emphasized on developing an effective information security model to curb the growing technology based menace.

The event ended by presentation of mementoes to all the speakers and an informal vote of thanks.

He also stated that the importance of internet communication in the modern life has gone so deep that deprivation of the facility can be considered as violation of human right.

Prof Shubhomay Maitra from Indian Statistical Institution, Kolkata, delivered the keynote address of the seminar. In his address he emphasized on the requirement and importance related to the cybersecurity especially

considering the modern day's mammoth use of cyber network for commercial use all over the world costing billions and billions dollar of worth. Therefore he deliberated on the cryptography and its development and progress towards the provision of security of network information system. He added that with the advent of "Digital Computer Network"-Cryptography for information network development has earned an important and significant measure against the violation of cyber security.

The Chief Guest of the occasion, Prof Dilip Kumar Basu, Ex-Vice Chancellor of Burdwan University & University of Tripura appreciated the other speakers for bringing out the essence of the subject theme and deliberations on the development and measures being taken up to provide the best cybersecurity measures. He, however cautioned that this process needs continuous efforts to make it foolproof system in view of class of brain working against the security measures for reaping the illegal benefits by penetrating through security measures embedded in multi billion dollar commercially valued cybernetwork.
