enhancing the activities of the Institution in the years ahead.

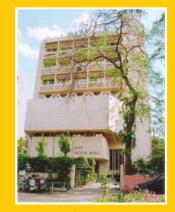

## **News From Headquarters**

#### 53rd Annual Technical Convention of IETE

Making Telecom & IT- Green: Challenges & Road Ahead" was the theme of 53<sup>rd</sup> Annual Technical Convention of IETE, held at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi during 25<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup> Sept 2010. The topic was chosen keeping in mind the huge energy consumption by telecom & IT industry and its adverse impact on the environment. The overwhelming growth of mobile communications & internet users in the country made the experts ponder about the serious & far reaching impact on the environment and life in general. The conference was very well organized and attended by large participants of engineers, academicians, professionals, R&D organizations, defense etc. It brought forth successfully

the necessity & potential of green technologies in the four technical sessions of the convention.

The inaugural address commenced with the welcome address and overview of the theme by Shri R K Gupta, Chairman, Technical Programmes Committee. The Presidential address was delivered by Lt Gen A K Agarwal, PVSM (Retd). He emphasized the need for coordinated action plan for achieving global objectives of green technologies. Dr K Radhakrishnan, Chairman ISRO & Secretary, Dept of Space, Bangalore, was honoured with Honorary Fellowship of IETE by the outgoing President of IETE for his contribution in the area of Science & Technology. Shri P N Chopra, DIG, BSF (Retd) and Prof (Dr) K K Bhutani, Director, UPTEC, Computer Consultancy Ltd, Allahabad, were conferred Distinguished Fellowships of IETE. Long Serving Retiring Council Members - Shri K Babu Rao (in absentia), Prof S S Agrawal and Dr (Mrs) Sneh Mohan were also honored during the occasion.

Shri R K Gupta was installed as the President of IETE by the Chief Guest during the inaugural session of ATC on Sept 25, 2010. Brig V K Panday (Retd), Secretary General IETE, introduced Shri R K Gupta to the assembled fraternity. Lt Gen Ashok Agarwal, PVSM (Retd), the outgoing President expressed confidence that under the able stewardship of Shri R K Gupta, IETE would surge ahead. Shri R K Gupta in his address conveyed his thanks to all the Council members for reposing confidence

in him as the President of the Institution. Quoting from the speeches of Dr Manmohan Singh (India's Prime Minister) and Mr James Madison (United States Fourth President), he said that IETE would always be guided by their inspiring thoughts and strive hard to see that every Indian is its own Governor by acquiring adequate knowledge, as per their quotes. Outlining his agenda he emphasized that IETE shall join hands with like minded organizations like IGNOU, ISRO and AICTE etc for accomplishing the set task and reiterated IETE's efforts to promote extensive use of ICTs for upliftment of the people in the rural areas; efforts to adopt all feasible media tools & applications to disseminate education like it is executing through EDUSAT network bringing interactive education via virtual classrooms. He mentioned that in the coming years for proper access to its members & students, IETE's thrust area would be to bring closer the IETE Centres and Students community especially in the North-East States and to adopt some practical measures for their welfare. Announcing the newly constituted Committees, Boards and other functionaries of IETE, he hoped that together with their & Council's help he would be able to fulfill the aspirations & expectations of all.

Dr K Radhakrishnan, Chairman ISRO & Secretary, Dept of Space, Bangalore, the Chief Guest at 53rd IETE ATC, in his inaugural address said that he was honoured & privileged to accept the Honorary Life Fellowship of the institution and acknowledged the great effort IETE was putting up for the outreach of technical education in the country. Talking of the Indian Space Programme he said that it was inspired by a vision to utilize space for the common man, a vision shared, sustained and enriched as it evolved over the past five decades. Today, he said that the fruits of space research were reaching the common people and society, touching their daily life, be it a fisherman, farmer, student, patients from remote areas, an administrator or a policy maker. He talked about Indian satellites designed to provide global data on ocean colour and winds like Oceansat-2; the development of GSAT4 satellite with Ka band transponders and onboard processing; successful launch of high resolution satellite-CARTOSAT 2B and four co-passenger satellites; launch of an earth observation visualization portal called Bhuvan; ISRO's next generation launch vehicle GSLV Mk III with the successful static testing of its L-110 liquid core stage and the strap-on solid motor S200 and the future launching of Resourcesat-2, Radar Imaging Satellite and GSAT-12; GSAT-5P & GSAT-7 to be launched by GSLV and Hylas satellite. He revealed that Indian space programme was on the threshold of a transition towards developing newer capabilities, perspectives and directions with a quantum jump in the missions for next years, towards increasing the availability of transponders, enhancing capability for Earth Observation including microwave imaging. He also talked of ISRO's future plans & developments on the navigational front and its partnership programmes / collaborations with other countries for various future projects. He informed that in future ISRO's focus would be towards low cost access to space, earth observation for environment monitoring and climate change. He also told about ISRO's initiative on studies of critical technologies for human spaceflights.

The Chief Guest and the dignitaries released the ATC Souvenir-cum-Proceedings before the IETE Annual Awards (2010) announcement. Best Performing Centres/ Sub-Centres Awards for the year 2009-10 were bagged by **IETE Delhi Centre** (1st Prize), **IETE Mankapur Centre** (2nd Prize) and **IETE Dharwad Sub-Centre** (1st Prize).

The 42<sup>nd</sup> Bhabha Memorial Lecture was delivered by Prof Bikas Sinha, Homi Bhabha Prof, Dept of Atomic Energy, Variable Energy Cyclotron Centre, Kolkata, on the subject "Sustainable Clean Energy Resource- A New Paradigm for Saving the Earth". He mentioned that along with Greenhouse Effect, Global warming and its adverse effects on the planet were indeed the threatening prospects. Therefore the dependence has to be on non-conventional energy sources, such as nuclear, solar and other renewable resources along with more environmentally friendly fossil fuels like coal and oil. In his

address he discussed the seriousness of the carbon dioxide induced greenhouse effect and an efficient route of producing clean energy. Direct relevance to eastern India was also touched upon in his address.

The Technical Session-I on "Green Telecom Technologies-I" chaired by Lt Gen D P Sehgal, PVSM, AVSM, VSM (Retd) featured lectures by Shri Rajiv Mehrotra, Chairman Shyam Telecom Ltd; Dr Pawan Kapur, Dir, CSIO, Chandigarh on "ICT for Green City-Issues & Concern"; Col Mahesh Khera on "The Operations of Telecom Networks & Data Centres" and Shri R K Vohra, Vice President, Tata Technologies, on "Green Technology". The Technical Session -II was on "Green Telecom Technologies-II" chaired by Shri Sushil Kumar Jewarajka, Chairman Artheon Group, CMD Essjay Ericsson Pvt Ltd and Chairman FICCI, Western Regional Council. This session contained lectures by Shri T R Tua, DDG, COAI, who spoke on "Green Telecom:Indian Perspective and Green requirement in the sector"; Shri Mrinmoy Chattaraj, a cool IT campaigner, expressing his concerns on issues related to energy footprint of the ICT Industry and ICT sector's role in developing sustainable technological solutions in mitigating climate change. He talked on "Use of Energy Efficient Telecom Towers"; Gp Capt K P Gowd, Systems Branch, HQ SFC, Delhi Cantt, New Delhi, spoke on "Parameters for Selection of a Green ICT Product" and Shri Vipin Tyagi, Director C-DoT on "Green Telecom & IT" for optimizing WWF(Water Watts & Food) through broadband".

The Technical Session-III was deliberated on "Green Environment-I" chaired by Maj Gen V K Passi (Retd). Speakers in this session included Lt Col Maneesh Joshi, Army Technology Centre, HQ Tech Gp, EME, who spoke on "Looking into serious problems of e-waste Management"; Shri Abhishek Pratap, a senior Green Electronics Campaigner from Green Peace India, spoke on "E-Waste Management in India"; Ms Subhalakshmi Krishnamoorthy, Scientist, LEOS, ISRO on "Solar Energy for powering Telecom and its Equipment & Devices" and Gp Capt Apte, who spoke on behalf of Shri M G Kulkarni, highlighting the "Use of ICT Technology for Reducing Pollution of the Planet & Eco-Friendly to Improve the Quality of Life". The concluding Session IV "Green Environment-II" was chaired by Maj Gen T M Mhaisale, Commander HQ Tech Gp, EME. The issues discussed in this session were by Brig A S Nagra, HQ Tech Gp, EME, on "Radiation effects on Telecom Towers"; **Prof V R Singh**, Scientist, Dir, Distinguished Researcher, NPL, New Delhi, on "Ubiquitous Green E-Technology for better Environment"; **Ms Parimita Mohanty**, Research Associate TERI, expressed her views on "Potential for Energy Conversation and Use of Renewable Energy Technologies in the Telecom Shelters" and **Shri Bal Kishen**, Dir, TEC on "Radiation Effects of Mobile Services".

In the valedictory session the Chief Guest was **Prof P B Sharma**, Vice—Chancellor, Delhi Technological University, who in his speech said that going green meant going back to nature, it also meant handling definite spectrum, technologies and convergence. He said that atleast green waves were being created in such kind of green conventions but cautioned about underlying huge challenges which required advance R&D; developing of intelligent & smart materials, energy efficiency; energy ecycling; greater visibility, more awareness and connection of mind with mind. He appealed to IETE to promote the

'element of pancharas' for sensitizing one and all. The panelists in the panel session included Lt Gen D P Sehgal, PVSM, AVSM, VSM (Retd); Maj Gen V K Passi (Retd); Maj Gen T M Mhaisale; Shri R K Gupta, President IETE; Lt Gen AK Agarwal, PVSM (Retd) and Brig V K Panday (Retd). Best Paper Awards Ceremony was also held prior to the panel discussion. The pre-convention meetings on 24 Sept 2010, included Students' Session followed by presentation of IETE Academic Awards; Council Meetings, 56<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting and 1<sup>st</sup> (2009-2010) Special General Meeting of IETE. The Convention came to close with proposing vote of thanks by **Brig V K Panday (Retd)**, Secretary General, IETE.

#### **IETE Apex Forum**

IETE Apex Forum Meeting on "Developing India into Telecom Equipment Manufacturing Hub-Opportunities & Challenges" was held on 01 Sep 2010 at IETE, New Delhi. Shri Arun Maira, Member Planning Commission, Govt of India, was the Chief Guest. The Guest of Honour, Shri Rajiv Mehrotra, President TEMA, and Chairman, Shyam Telcom Ltd, delivered the keynote address. **The expert panelists** included: Shri Vipin Kumar, Sr DDG, DOT; Shri Bharat Bhatia, Regional Director, Motorola India Ltd; Shri Vipin Tyagi, Director & Member of Board, C-DOT; Shri R K Jain, IAS, Chief Joint Secretary, NMCC; Shri Aditya Dixit, Quad Electronics Solutions, Hyderabad; Shri T V Ramachandran, Regional Director, Vodafone Essar Mobile Services Ltd and Shri Vinod Sharma, ELCINA. Shri P P Malhotra, Chairman Industrial Coordination Committee (ICC) gave the welcome address and an overview of the Apex Forum. He mentioned of a world class network of telecom services established in the country, but yet to be realized was the underlying objective of NTP 1999 policy which directs to strengthen R&D efforts in the country and to provide an impetus to build world class manufacturing capabilities.

He mentioned about the country's successful technology leadership & indigenization in space and in establishing sustainable eco-system in the Auto industry. Shri R K Gupta, President-Elect & Co-Chairman, ICC, in his address emphasized on having India's own manufacturing power, for which he said Govt. should encourage industry and give incentives and have its own technology. Shri Gupta ruled out the possibility of adopting 'swadeshiness' as it would not work in this competitive world, unless India is strong enough in terms of cost & reliability. Shri Rajiv Mehrotra, President, TEMA and Chairman, Shyam Telecom, emphasized on the intellectual knowledge of the product development;

the creation of IPRs; data products, source codes or software codes rather than pleading from outside; the need to follow China's policy of protecting local telecom industry and on R&D cess for R&D funding.

Shri Arun Maira, Member Planning Commission, expressed a great concern about the shallow & fragile condition of industry in the economy. He mentioned the mid-term appraisal of the 11th five year plan by the Planning Commission revealed India's failing to build manufacturing capacity and intellectual property development within the country. The Planning Commission was keen to accelerate the growth of the genuine industry in the country and suggested that IETE being a scientific & professional society should be unbiased and neutral with regard to information and should take down the point of views from all associations, bodies associated with the sector, analyze the information and then evolve a consensus policy view to place before the government with no conflicts of interests. He suggested manufacturing bodies to play out their stories by suggesting what things were being done & anticipate the reactions to those things and then convey their role. President IETE, Lt Gen A K Agarwal, PVSM (Retd) in his address assured neutrality & professionalism of IETE and it's working for the interest of the technology to meet common objectives & goals of the country. He mentioned about the TRAC Committee in IETE having the same role i.e. to analyse the global trends of new technologies, taking into account all related techno-economic aspects and highlighting the issues which were affecting Telecom industry and then passing it on to the Govt. or Policy makers. IETE, he said, was ready to take a lead and create a database and awareness among the fraternity so that right path is shown.

Shri Vipin Kumar, Sr DDG, emphasized on establishing a culture of innovation, mandatory R&D Centre by the manufacturers, establishing of a nodal agency, formulation of a policy framework congenial for Indian manufacturing, a well articulated manufacturing strategy and its effective implementation; setting up of a nodal agency for telecom manufacturing. Shri Vipin Tyagi, Director, Centre for Development of Telematics (C-DOT) emphasized on cultural adaptation of products & innovation; control on slow dumping of technologies; creation of ecologies by indigenous inputs for components; state-of-the-art R&D, creation of systems and producing market oriented products; addressing the R&D into manufacturing cycle; building of confidence in the policies, having credible databases and indigenous inputs. Shri T V Ramachandran, Regional Director, Vodafone Essar Mobile Services Ltd, mentioned about having no supporting manufacturing base but the presence of demand pull from the consumer industry; need of looking into the duties/ levies/ taxes in the sector; need of product innovation to meet consumer's requirements; involvements & participations of India in international forums on formulation of standards. Shri Bharat Bhatia, Regional Director Asia, Motorola GGA, spoke on "Developing an Eco-System for Telecom Equipment Manufacturing" and emphasized on planning of the core strategy and implementation of correct policy directions, of having own IPRs and technology. developing eco-system etc were some of the points raised, aiming to help India become a manufacturing hub. Shri Vinod Sharma, ELCINA, pointed out that component industry in India was destroyed by making it uncompetitive that has led to the closure of many companies in the country. Constraints of high freight cost within the country adding to manufacturing cost; poor infrastructure of power & transport causing delays and adding to manufacturing cost, were the factors to be blamed apart from necessity for setting up cluster approach to establish sustainable eco-system in telecom manufacturing and tax relaxation. Shri Aditya Dixit, QUAD Electronics Solutions, Hyderabad, talked of missing specialization corridors, market maturity, lack of logistics and finances. The key remained in convincing the Indian Telecom Service providers to support Indian manufacturing through a combination of policy measures and sound economic logic. Shri R K Jain, the National Manufacturing Competitiveness Council (NMCC) explained the motive of its organization and assured to provide an integrated support through his channel towards the effective outcome of the forum.

Some of the salient recommendations that came out after expert's views during deliberations in the Interactive session of this Apex Forum were: Building Intellectual Property and strengthening R & D; Telecom equipment testing & certification facilities; Stimuli to domestic industry by creating a strong market pull; Boosting Telecom Exports; Enabling Policy Initiatives & Rationalise Tax Structure; Establishing of a Nodal agency; Clusters/SEZs Development and boost to Electronic Component Industry.
